Program

The Treatment and Research Institute for Autism Spectrum Disorders (TRIAD) announces a new program for parents of infants and toddlers who have concerns about autism risk.

Services

Through the Parent Support and Education Program – Infant and Toddler Screening Clinic (PSEP-ITS), autism specialists provide information, support, and diagnostic consultation for parents of children under 2-years-old. This includes developmental screening for infant siblings of children with autism spectrum disorders.



Our Mission

The PSEP-ITS philosophy is to build on the strengths of children and families to support their growth and development.

The PSEP-ITS clinic strives to implement state-of-the-art clinical practices in order to provide families with cutting-edge information about their children.

PSEP-ITS is designed to facilitate appropriate early intervention services tailored to individual family needs.

PSEP-ITS strives to serve the scientific community by gathering information that contributes to research on best practices.

PSEP-ITS serves as an adjunct to, rather than a replacement for, existing community services.

Clinic Format

Participation involves an initial visit to Vanderbilt for diagnostic screening, with follow-up services scheduled as warranted. Screenings are conducted by TRIAD staff psychologists.
